

Rome Declaration
by the
European Law School (Network)
Berlin/London/Paris/Rome/Amsterdam

2017, marking the 60th anniversary of the Treaty of Rome installing the European Communities and Union, marking the 10th anniversary of the Agreement installing the European Law School sees important developments which might well shape the future of Europe. The European Law School is the first and only institution offering a regular pan-European curriculum in law for the study of several national laws and European law and is formed by leading institutions of core Member States.

In the light of these developments, the European Law School (Network)

1. declares its willingness to keep strong links between the universities and law schools on the European continent and in the United Kingdom, namely between the law schools participating in the network and supporting the freedom of students to study across national borders;
2. expresses its objective to work for a European and a world order characterized by mutual understanding and cooperation, through educational and other relationships, based upon our different legal traditions and the respect for the universal human rights;
3. declares its willingness to develop on a global basis ways of involving universities outside the European Law School Network in our activities (such as the annual summer schools, PhD exchanges and international conferences).
