
Russian Aggression, the War in Ukraine and the Future of International Criminal Justice





## The ESIL Interest Group on International Criminal Justice, in collaboration with the Journal of International Criminal Justice

In November 2022, the Journal of International Criminal Justice (JICJ) published a symposium on Russian Aggression and the War in Ukraine (edited by Julia Geneuss and Florian Jeßberger), offering critical reflections on the ongoing war and international criminal law. The issue deals with several aspects, including Russia's memory laws justifying the aggression against Ukraine, the challenges and opportunities of domestic prosecution of international crimes in Ukraine, the digital documentation of international crimes, the use of the term "genocide" in relation to the situation in Ukraine, the double standards in the West's approach to international law, and the possibility of establishing a special tribunal for the crime of aggression.

One year after the full-scale invasion of Ukraine by Russia, and in light of the recent issuance of arrest warrants against Vladimir Putin and Maria Lvova-Belova for war crimes, the European Society of International Law's Interest Group in International Criminal Justice, in collaboration with the symposium editors and the JICJ, would like to invite you to an online event to revisit the symposium.
