Call for Applications for two doctoral scholarships (2021-2025) funded by the DAAD

Application deadline: April 30, 2021

The doctoral programme Law & Society of the Integrative Research Institute Law & Society (LSI) in cooperation with the Berlin Graduate School of Social Sciences (BGSS) is currently accepting applications for two doctoral scholarships at the Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin funded by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD, Graduate School Scholarship Programme). The scholarship of up to four yeas includes a monthly instalment, language courses and other benefits. Excellent international students with an interest in interdisciplinary legal research are strongly encouraged to apply.

1. The doctoral programme Law & Society

The LSI and the BGSS have established the joint doctoral programme *Law & Society* to promote innovative interdisciplinary legal research. The programme is dedicated to investigating the role and function of law for tackling the current and fundamental challenges for a democratic global society (inter alia climate change, digital transformation, the rise of populism and the decline of the rule of law) from a genuinely interdisciplinary perspective.

The programme offers interdisciplinary supervision and support of the doctoral students within the international structured doctoral programme of the BGSS. The LSI is a stimulating interdisciplinary and international research environment in the heart of Berlin at the Humboldt-University.

The courses of the doctoral programme will be taught in English. However, applicants are expected to acquire a working knowledge of German. Fully funded language courses will be available as part of the doctoral scholarship. The doctoral thesis may be written in English or German.

2. Application requirements

The doctoral programme *Law & Society* welcomes applications from highly qualified graduate students committed to excellence in interdisciplinary legal research. Applicants should hold a graduate degree (Master) in law, social sciences or other fields of research and are expected to pursue a genuinely interdisciplinary project within the framework of the doctoral programme *Law & Society*. Key selection criterion is the quality of the research proposal, how well it reflects the thematic agenda of the doctoral programme *Law & Society* and its likeliness to contribute to interdisciplinary legal research.

At the time when DAAD receives the nomination letter, the last final exam (Master Degree or equivalent) must have taken place no longer than six years ago.

At the time when DAAD receives the nomination letter, applicants must not have resided in Germany for more than 15 months prior to the nomination. International students with a non-German citizenship are therefore strongly encouraged to apply.

3. The doctoral scholarship

The doctoral scholarships will start preferably on September 1, 2021 (open to negotiation). Scholarship holders will receive a grant from the Graduate School Scholarship Programme (GSSP) of the DAAD for up to four years. The scholarship award includes:

- a scholarship instalment of currently € 1,200 per month;
- travel allowance;
- payments towards health, accident and personal liability insurance cover;
- a research allowance of currently € 460 per year (for scholarship holders from emerging countries), or € 230 per year (for scholarship holders from industrialized countries);
- under certain circumstances, grant holders may receive the following additional benefits:
 - monthly rent subsidy;
 - o monthly allowance for accompanying family members (about € 200 child allowance per child and about € 275 marriage allowance);
- preliminary language course (if desired and possible due to the starting date of the scholarship).

4. The application procedure

The DAAD scholarship holders will be selected in a two-step procedure. In step 1, appropriate candidates are nominated for a DAAD scholarship by the doctoral programme *Law & Society* as the hosting programme. In step two, the nominees (2 for each scholarship) submit an online application with supporting documentation via the DAAD portal and the DAAD selection board will make the final decision.

Application documents for step 1

Please submit the following documents in German or English as one pdf file:

- 1. Letter of motivation (not exceeding 1,000 words)
- 2. Curriculum Vitae
- 3. Research proposal of the planned dissertation project, including a short abstract and a work schedule (not exceeding 5 pages)
- 4. Two letters of recommendation, each by a university professor from your home university, issued during the last two years. Please use the <u>DAAD form</u>. The letters of recommendation are not required by the application deadline and can be handed in later.
- 5. Certificates or translated documents:

- a. School leaving certificate (College, GSEC etc.) qualifying for admission to higher education in your home country
- b. Certificate of an academic degree(s)
- c. Transcripts of records: Certificates of annual examinations taken at the home university

6. Language certificates:

- a. English (TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge, etc. or English-taught degree)
- b. German (DSD, Goethe Institut, TELC, etc. or German taught degree); knowledge of the German language can also be acquired during the research at Humboldt-University. Knowledge of the German language is not a requirement for the application.
- 7. Any documents certifying completed practical work (internships etc.)
- 8. A list of publications (if applicable)
